ENTRIES: No entries will be taken by Show Secretary over the phone. Entries must be accompanied by a signed check/money order. Pre-entry applies to entries postmarked or received in person before Midnight (Pacific Time) on online registration date printed in the premium. All checks presented to NSHA Region V that fail to clear their banking facility for any reason whatsoever, will be assessed a \$40.00 returned check fee in addition to the amount of the original draft. All fees and assessments must be paid by the maker of the draft within ten (10) days of notification from the financial institution of the bad draft by Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested. Until such time that the bad draft has been paid to any Officer, membership and points earned at any function, activity, or event, will be withheld until all fees and assessments are paid in full. If an individual has a draft returned a second time, the assessment fee will again be charged, and that individual will be required to pay any future charges and fees by Money Order, Cashier's Check or Cash for a period of one (1) year from date of the second infraction. NSHA V Rules & Bylaws, Article III Section 4. If you pay in advance of the show completion, please know that when your show billing is reviewed at the end of the show your bill total may change and you will be responsible for payment to close out that bill. CANCELLATIONS/WITHDRAWALS: Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or cancel any entry of any exhibitor.

NON - RESPONSIBILITY CLAUSE: All horses exhibited in this show will be done so entirely at the owner's, rider's, driver's, or handler's risk. NSHA Region V, NSHA State and Clark County Horseman's Park will not be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. Each exhibitor will be responsible for all injury that may be occasioned to each person, whosoever, by any horse (or other animal) owned or exhibited by him/her, or that may arise from negligence of the person in charge of such animal. Signing the entry or entering online through the website binds you to all the rules of the show and affirms you have read, understand, and agree to all information in the premium list. you acknowledge you have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all rules of the show and all information in the prize list.

NSHA V Show Rules

Every class offered herein, which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current NSHA V & USEF rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith; any changes or corrections of rules will automatically become part of this Prize List. It is solely the exhibitor's responsibility to be fully familiar with NSHA V, USEF, and Breed Association rules, respectively. If NSHA V rules do not cover, then refer to USEF rules. If USEF rules do not cover then refer to Breed Rules. Rule questions at shows shall be immediately referred to the Show Manager and then to available Show Committee Members (including Board of Directors present) whose decision will be final. Limited copies of NSHA V bylaws/rules and Show Premium will be available in Show Office.

"The show management reserves the right to excuse any horse or rider from the ring for any cause deemed sufficient by Show Management including, but not limited to, abuse of a horse, unmanageable horse, profane language or unsportsmanlike conduct." Any acts of abuse outside of the show ring should be reported to Clark County Animal Control.

Non-protest-able decisions. The following items are not protest-able: 1. The soundness of a horse when determined by a licensed veterinarian or the Judge. 2. Any decisions of the Judges, except, if a violation of conduct has occurred. While the Judge may speak to exhibitors, exhibitors MAY NOT approach the Judge until after the show is completed. All questions, concerns, issued during the show must be directed to the Show Manager. Private videos are not accepted as basis of protest or request to change class placings.

Open Classes: An open class is open to all horses of any age size, sex or breed. Must be serviceably sound and in good condition. Junior Exhibitor/Youth may not show/handle stallions.

Restricted class. A class that is titled for a specific age group of horses or riders, specific breeds or offers specifics for an animal's previous winnings, discipline shown or experience under saddle.

Junior Exhibitor Classes: Junior exhibitor classes are open to horses and/or ponies. Stallions are prohibited in junior exhibitor classes. Junior/youth riders 17 years and under are required to wear ASTM approved helmets for English classes. Junior exhibitors are 17 years & under.

Adult Amateur Exhibitor: A person who after their 18th birthday has not in any way engaged in any activities which would make them a professional, including, but not limited to, accepting remuneration for riding, driving, showing, training, schooling, conducting clinics or seminars and giving riding instructions.

Adult Amateur Division: High Point Adult Amateur Senior and Walk Trot Jog Rider. One horse, one rider only to count. All Adult Amateur classes to count as specified in Rule 4, Section 6, Paragraphs 1-6.

Walk-Trot-Jog Exhibitor High Point Adult Amateur are Open to **Amateur** Riders. Riders that have cantered in any show or competition may enter walk/trot classes. However, change from WTJ to WTC classes and vice versa can be done only once per season, you cannot enter 3 gaited classes during the same show. Should change occur, Show Secretary must be informed in writing and loss of previous division points occurs.

Walk-Trot-Jog Classes are Open to ANY Exhibitor and/or Horse. HOWEVER, that horse and rider combination **MAY NOT CROSS ENTER into ANY three-gaited classes at the same Show.** Change from WTJ to WTC classes and vice versa can be done only once per season, you cannot enter 3 gaited classes during the same show. Should change occur, Show Secretary must be informed in writing and loss of previous division points occurs.

Lead Line is required for Riders 6 & Under and Riders 10 & Under in NSHA V Lead Line classes. No cross entry between Walk Only Lead Line and Walk Trot Lead Line at the same show. *FOR SAFETY LEAD LINE MUST BE SECURELY ATTACHED TO A HALTER, NOT THE BRIDLE*

Performance, Equitation, and Horsemanship classes. All horses in all performance classes, equitation and horsemanship classes must be serviceably sound and free of all lameness. Performance Classes include Halter Classes, Pleasure, Trail and Working Western Horse Classes.

Halter Horse: NSHA V rule 4, Section 1, Horses must be serviceably sound and shown in hand at the walk and trot.

Halter Horse Solid Color: OPEN TO ALL BREEDS AND SEXES. HORSE TO BE JUDGED on standard outlined above from NSHA V rule 4, Section 1. Solid color is a solid color coat pattern which includes horses with a blaze, snip, and/or stockings such as Buckskin, Bays, Palominos, Chestnuts, or Grays.

Halter Horse Multi Color: OPEN TO ALL BREEDS AND SEXES. HORSES TO BE on standard outlined above from NSHA V rule 4, Section 1. Multi-color is a multi-color coat pattern which includes Paints, Pintos, Appaloosas, etc.

NSHA V Show Rules (CONTINUED)

English and Western Junior Horse: Horses five (5) years or younger to be exhibited in an approved snaffle bit or bosal per NSHA and Breed Rules. NSHA V does not have separate Junior Horse Classes this season, however if exhibitor identifies their horse on Registration Form with age documentation as Junior Horse, NSHA V will track points earned by placing within All Open unrestricted performance classes to count (Rule 4, Section 2, Paragraphs 1- 13;), (Halter Open, Pleasure Open, and Trail Open Classes for Trophy/Buckle, and NSHA V Member Year-End Awards).

English and Western Senior Horse: Horses six (6) years of age or older. See bit rules in NSHA V Show Rule 3, Sections 6, 7, 8, and 12 (page 12-13 at www.nshalv.com). Senior Horses may be ridden in a snaffle bit in all Walk/Trot classes. NSHA V does not have separate Senior Horse Classes this season, however if exhibitor identifies their horse on Registration Form as Senior Horse with age documentation, NSHA V will track points earned by placing within All Open unrestricted performance classes to count (Rule 4, Section 2, Paragraphs 1-13;), (Halter Open, Pleasure Open, and Trail Open Classes for Trophy/Buckle, and NSHA V Member Year-End Awards).

Reining Classes Open: Pattern Class. Horses to be judged in accordance with the current rules of the AQHA and/or the NRHA with patterns chosen from either rule book.

Ranch Riding Open: Pattern Class. Horses to be judged in accordance with the current rules of the AQHA, no banding, no hoof black, no fake tails. Horse may cross enter into a Pleasure class or a Walk/Trot Pleasure Class at the same show regardless of division.

Ranch Pleasure Open: Rail Class. In all gaits, movement of the ranch rail pleasure horse should simulate a horse needing to cover long distances, softly and quietly, like that of a working ranch horse. This class should show the horse's ability to work at a forward, working speed while under control by the rider. Light contact should be rewarded, and horse shall not be shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manners and responsiveness of the horse while performing the maneuver requirements and the horse's quality of movement are the primary considerations.

Ranch Horse Halter Confirmation Open: Horses must be presented well-groomed, no hair trimmed from their ears or muzzle. Bridle path trimming should be avoided. Tails should be natural. False tails, mane and/or forelock inserts, hoof black, hoof spray and/or face make-up is not permitted. Horses are to be shown in a good working halter: rope, braided, nylon or plain leather. Horses will walk to the judge one at a time. As the horse approaches, the judge will step to the right to enable the horse to trot straight to a cone placed 12-15 yards away. At the cone, the horse will continue trotting, turn to the left, and trot toward the wall or fence of the arena. After trotting the horses will be lined up head to tail for individual inspection by the judge. Horses should stand square with a natural neck- headset. Exhibitors should stay on the opposite side from the judge, to keep the horse exposed to the judge.

Miniature Horse, Pony, Burro, and Mule: Open to Equines of all ages and all sizes 46" and under. Division Classes are listed in the Show Premium. May be shown in Western or English attire and tack. NSHA V and American Miniature Horse Association (AMHA) guidelines for these classes will be followed

Standard of Dress-English, Hunter, and Western: Rule 2, Section 2, A, B, and C (page 10-11) for all classes including the English and Western Warm Up classes. Exception for Region V: Chaps are Optional, Belts (Belts must be worn on trousers or pants that have belt loops.) Helmet in English Trail Classes is required.

Horsemanship classes: Emphasis shall be placed on horse and rider working together. Execution and correct form of both horse and rider while maintaining a pleasurable ride is the main criteria for this class. Exhibitors will be required to perform a pattern. Rule 4, Section 5: Senior Division, Section 6: Adult Amateur and Section 7: Junior Division. This rule applies with the exception, that there will be no rail work as this class is specific to NSHA Region V.

English Pleasure Division: NSHA Rule 4, Section 2-4. English or Hunter tack may be used. Horses are to enter at a trot tracking left and to be shown at the walk, trot, canter or gaits appropriate to the breed being shown. All horses must show both ways of the ring. The judge may request that horses be shown at an extended trot and hand gallop except in Junior Horse and Junior Exhibitor/Youth classes. At all gaits, reins are to maintain light contact on the mouth, so horse is under control at all times. Horse must stand quietly and back readily when asked. Formal attire not required.

Western Pleasure Division - All divisions to be shown at a walk, jog, and lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint, both ways of the ring. NSHA Rule 4, Section 2, #7. **Chaps are Optional.**

In-Hand Trail: Open to horses of any age. To be shown in halter over an obstacle course. Horse may cross enter any other mounted trail class.

SHOW HIGH POINT AWARD/YEAR END AWARDS

All points are awarded to the **HORSE (H)** in Horse Shows unless otherwise specified by class name or in the premium list. Points are awarded to the **RIDER/HANDLER (R)** for Showmanship, Lead line, Equitation, Horsemanship classes. Some divisions combine classes in which points totaled are earned by **HORSE (H)** and **RIDER/HANDLER (R)**. No Membership, No Nomination or No Volunteer Hours required for Show High Point Award. NSHA V reserves the right to correct, add or delete class from Show High Points according to the By-Law and Show Rules Review. Ties broken by the greatest number of first places in the Division, followed by greatest number of second places in the Division, followed by the greatest number of third places and so on.

NSHA Region V Bylaws and Show Rules B. Eligibility for individual class awards for all NSHA Region V recognized classes requires horses to be shown, and riders or handlers to show a minimum of three (3) shows in the same class a minimum of three (3) times for points in that specific class to count. This requirement applies to ALL individual class awards.

*Required NSHA Region V Membership & Nomination of Horse and Rider & Breed Registration prior to first show. Member/Nomination Form found at www.nshalv.com. Four (4) hours of Volunteer Services at our Shows is required to receive Year-End Awards. A buy your volunteer hours program is available at (\$25 per hour). See our Show Secretary in the show office or email nshavegas@gmail.com. Two (2) General Membership Meetings are required for Year-End Awards.
